Check our website for up-to-date shuttle information from the University of Washington Light Rail Station and Seattle Prep School. Bike racks will also be available all weekend for visitors to use.

This year's menu of traditional Greek food will focus on the favorites, including but not limited to gyros, souvlaki, lamb, roasted chicken, spanakopita and more. Additionally, we'll have a selection of homemade Greek sweets and pastries prepared by members of St. Demetrios.

Greek wine tasting will be available, and Greek beer and wine will also be served in our Taverna bar, which will feature big screen TVs showing all the weekend's major sporting events.

The award-winning St. Demetrios Greek dance groups and live Greek music will entertain visitors on the main stage throughout the weekend. Families can head to the children's area, which will have activities and games ideal for our youngest guests. Visitors can also take tours of the church if they wish to view St. Demetrios' beautiful sanctuary, including two new, large mosaics, and learn more about the Orthodox faith.
