

Seattle Greek Festival returns October 2–4 for a weekend of authentic Greek food and cultural experiences

The festival features authentic cuisine, live music and traditional dance performances, church tours, artisan shopping, and family-friendly activities celebrating Greek heritage.

SEATTLE – The Seattle Greek Festival is happening October 2–4, 2026, bringing Greek culture and hospitality to Seattle in the Montlake neighborhood. Hosted by Saint Demetrios Greek Orthodox Church, the annual festival invites everyone to share a weekend of Greek food, entertainment, and community.

A Seattle tradition since 1960, the Seattle Greek Festival takes place at Saint Demetrios Greek Orthodox Church, 2100 Boyer Avenue East, Seattle, WA. Event hours are 12 – 9 p.m. on Friday, October 2; 10 a.m. – 9 p.m. on Saturday, October 3; and 11 a.m. – 6 p.m. on Sunday, October 4.

This year's menu of traditional Greek food will focus on festival favorites, including but not limited to gyros, souvlaki, roasted chicken, domades, and spanakopita. Guests can also savor a selection of homemade Greek sweets and pastries prepared by members of St. Demetrios.

Soak in the atmosphere at the festival's Taverna with a glass of Greek wine or imported beer. Enjoy live Greek music spanning various genres and catch the weekend's major sporting events on big screen TVs.

The award-winning Saint Demetrios dance groups and live musicians will take the main stage throughout the weekend, filling the grounds with the energy and joy of Greek music and dance.

Shop at the festival's various markets for Greek grocery products, books, apparel and more. Young guests can enjoy the dedicated children's area, offering games and activities just for them.

Visitors are welcome to attend a tour of the inside of Saint Demetrios Church, to view its Byzantine architecture, including two recently installed large-scale mosaics, and learn about the Orthodox Christian faith.

The festival is a cashless event—all major credit and debit cards are accepted.

The Seattle Greek Festival is organized by volunteers from the Saint Demetrios community. All proceeds support the church's ministries, educational programs, and community outreach.
